Mercer University: Fulfilling a Vision and a Dream

Unto the Least of His' vision is to equip local churches to be more actively involved in Christian ministry and service. Mercer University contacted us about assisting them with information and expertise to Central America for their summer mission experience. We partnered with Goodwill Ind. and we were able to accomplish this task. Rev. Dimas Alvarado assisted us with transportation and lodging as well as his knowledge of Costa Rica.

Warner Robins First UMC & Hahira UMC

We were partners in equipping these churches for their mission trips to post Hurricane Katrina areas. Each of these mission teams did an excellent work for the Kingdom of God. Hahira UMC assisted a family so they could return home after 2 ½ years of being displaced. Warner Robins First UMC assisted in the rebuilding of Port Sulfur Baptist Church in Plaquemine Parish. They will be grateful for a long time for the acts of kindness to their congregation. Port Sulfur Baptist was one of the first response teams following the hurricane by passing out 2 ½ million pounds of food and supplies to the people. Also, 17 UMCOR trucks with cleaning supplies were distributed from their church.

Reaching Out: The Emmaus Community

The Emmaus Community of the Cordele area would like to have a Spanish Emmaus Walk weekend for Spanish-speaking people. We have been invited to be a partner in this new Emmaus Community venture. The men's walk will be first then the women's walk will take place. Please be in prayer that these walks can be accomplished by January of 2009.

Stuart First UMC also requested some leadership for a future trip to Costa Rica. We traveled to an indigenous area of Nosara Guanacaste. In this area, we established a work with Las Delicias School and an alcohol and drug rehab center. The Rehab center needed more dormitory space because of the problem of addiction is so prevalent in this area. Also, Las Delicias School was in much need of repair such as a new roof, painting and a new kitchen. Rev. Phillip Short and his congregation will assist in these projects this summer.

Wilmington Island UMC

The Wilmington Island mission group invited us to help with their planning meeting for a national mission experience. Some of the members stated that they want to be more involved. We explored different national mission trips such as post Hurricane Katrina locations.

Powersville and Upatoi UMC
