Spring Break Mission Trip

Super Storm Sandy affected our country about 6 months ago; it has left many people and their homes devastated. We have taken 3 mission teams to the area since January. Rev. Jim Dominey and firefighter Christian Ingram helped scout out future potential mission sites for us to work in. Christian and I led a group of first responders on our second team working with Team Jersey in moving people to new levels of hope and restoration. Our third mission team was made up of 33 college students from the Wesley House of Georgia College and State University in Milledgeville. We partnered with the Salvation Army at Seaside and Hartley, New Jersey. These areas were hit hard by the storm. We helped the Disaster Recovery Sites by unloading 3 trucks and stacking the items in their needed locations. Also, we helped service over 600 different families at these 2 locations with counseling, love and collections of needed items. We had an individual request salvation and another one request baptism while being there. Our lives are being changed as we involve ourselves in the work and mission of the church.
