The churches made a donation of \$17,299.99 toward these indigenous peoples' health and well-being!

God sowed blessings into their congregation and they used their blessings to bring a great harvest of souls to our God. What we are doing with our blessings today will help us know what kind of harvest we will have tomorrow! Thank you for an awesome expression of love!

Faith, Family & Missions Fundraiser

When Nancy and I accepted Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, He did a radical work on our love for each other, our family and our world. On April 23, at the Methodist Children's Home, we had a Family, Faith and Missions Banquet. Keith Brown was the brain child of this event. Our goal was to raise funds for 5 water wells in Northern Kenya. It was an absolutely wonderful night of worship. We had a delightful meal from Lonnie Bivens and staff and a meaningful message from Katharyn Richt with her husband, Mark, adding comments. The Richts family loves the Lord and they are deeply involved in Christian missions and ministries. We are very grateful to all who celebrated the night with us. American Natural Resources, owned by Tony, Sherry and Savannah Brady sponsored a water well during the event. As the celebration ended and the funds were counted by Keith Brown and others, we raised approximately \$65,000 for the water wells. Approximately 30,000 people will receive a drink of fresh clean water in Jesus' name. We have commissioned Michael Lolwerikoi of Asbury Seminary and Kenya to begin the work.

Our goal was 5 water wells but the devaluation of the dollar, the rising cost of diesel fuel, the high inflation of Kenya and the difficulty of transportation to these locations allowed only 3 water wells to be placed. The cost of the wells are approximately \$22,000. We are grateful for the 3 water wells and we will continue to believe God for the resources for more water wells so that the least will continue to be served.

In July, Rev. Eddie Morrison and I traveled to Nairobi, Kenya to meet Michael at the Nairobi Airport. It was a difficult trip, but we have seen the smiles of the Maasi people! We were excited to dedicate a water well to the glory of God and in honor of Mark and Katharyn Richt, their family and the University of Georgia Bulldog network.

On behalf of the recipients of these water wells we want to thank you for your thoughts, prayers, and financial gifts. We remember the words of Jesus, "when you do it unto the least of these, you have done it unto Me". Thank you!
