New Latrine Facility for Students

Thank you for your support of Nialla's Project for clean water and sanitation. We are excited to report that the project has been completed! What a blessing and praise! This project ensures clean water for hundreds of students and villagers and will help protect them from diseases such as cholera, typhoid, dysentery, giardiasis, polio, diarrhea, bilharzia, guinea worm, intestinal parasites, and trachoma, a leading cause of blindness. Today, because of your support, a community water filtering unit and water storage tank, 4 bathroom facility units, and 2 showers have been installed. The storage tank will especially be important in drought or water emergencies and will provide a close source of water throughout the year. In the past, water had to be trucked in from 15 miles away when water supplies failed. We also distributed soap and hygiene supplies to over 500 villagers as part of the community education program organized to help teach villagers and school-children about safe hygiene practices and the relationship between water, sanitation, and disease.
