A word from Bobby

Recently, I was at a mission conference at Pierce Chapel UMC in Columbus, Georgia and it was there that the Lord made us aware of His work in the Congo. Rev. Kimba Kyakutala Evariste of the Democratic Republic of the Congo was sharing his church's struggles and dilemmas. He was telling stories of pastors and members who are preaching the gospel in his country. There is a Bible shortage there and it was being divided into separate books so the Word could be preached in every church. He also told us of his pastors walking 85 kilometers (approx. 52.8 miles) to visit all the villages. As Kimba was speaking, God was speaking to my heart through him. I was wrestling with the small still voice on the inside of me. I was thinking that we could buy a bike and a Bible. I felt a gentle unction from God to do more, but I did not want to. Finally, I gave into the unction and I decided that we could purchase 2 Bibles and 2 bikes. Last of the big spenders for God and His works. 😊 But that little small voice on the inside made me think one more time. As I wrestled with this decision even more, I decided to call Kimba outside to a private place and pulled out an **“Unto the Least of His” check**. To hear and do the right thing is sometimes a struggle for me, even though I love God and His creation! The mark of a Christian life will be filled **with struggles for obedience and the blessings will be filled with “Yes Sir, Lord!”** for we are only stewards, here today and gone tomorrow. So what did I do? We wrote the check for 35 Bibles and 35 bikes! Help us, Lord, to be faithful stewards of your calling!

Work Going on in Africa

Another water well is complete with a fully installed solar power pump. It is serving 5,000 people/families, livestock and two schools. The water is pumped by solar power up to 3 miles. On behalf of the Samburu/Maasai people of Nkolngolitim of Wamba in North Kenya, we "thank you"! The solar power system is a breakthrough and a miracle. It is pumping water at 5 cubits per minute which means the 20,000 pint tank is full within 40 minutes.
