Rev. Michael Lolwerikoi, Phd. student at Asbury Seminary, has shared with us about his needs in Northern Kenya. Every day people from his village walk about 4 or 5 miles for fresh water. That seems far to walk on a daily basis, but the old water well was 7 miles away!

We think that it is time for this village to have its own bored water well. Our goal is to raise \$10,000 for this project. If there is any money left over from this project it will be used for purchasing livestock for Michael's village. Fifty-two children of the Methodist Home in Macon have pledged \$260 to this project. We are looking for 98 more partners who will share in this vision and give \$100 for this water well.
