ACCESS DENIED

Recently, I received some very disappointing news from the Delta Airlines. "Boarding declined!" I thought that I was totally prepared for boarding the plane for my intended destination. I had made arrangements for my ticket, transportation, yellow fever card, malaria medicine and my passport. My contact was ready on the other side of the world but there was a little detail that I missed. It is called, the Nigerian transitory visa. The Nigerian transitory visa is necessary for making a transfer in the Nigerian airport from one plane to the next. Panic set in! How and where could I obtain this visa that would allow me access to pass through the Logas, Nigerian airport? The ticket agent at the counter did not know the process of obtaining this visa.

This little detail that I missed cost me my flight and my experience in Kenya for the observing and digging of a new water well in the Nkutu village. Thankfully, Michael Lolwerikoi and Dr. Bill Goold of Asbury Theological Seminary could continue the work in Nkutu and the people of the village would not suffer because of my ignorance and neglect of details.

These are hard phrases to hear, "Access denied, boarding declined or it is too late!" It was an emotional and costly day for me when the ticketing agent said boarding declined. To be turned away or disqualified from the better things of life because of missing the details is difficult to hear and believe. The Nigerian visa experience taught me that I did not want to miss my plane, my family or my God because of missing the important details. Lord help us not to miss the important details or take for granted our lives, family and God.

UPDATE ON WATER WELL PROJECTS IN KENYA

The new water well projects in Kenya, which we drilled, have a high volume of clean safe drinking water. The shallow water well is at the Loijuk Nomadic village of 3,000 people. I have visited this new site and the people were very desperate and had no water. The few hand-dug water wells had dried up because of the prolonged drought. There have been no rains at all in Northern Kenya.

The second well site is Mbaringon Village Community. There were urgent and emergency cases of typhoid and dysentery in the area. As a result, we decided to drill the water well in this site for quick provision of safe clean drinking water. The population is 6,000 people including a nearby school with 300 students.

One student died as a result of dysentery and there were other cases of illnesses in the area. This problem of typhoid and water borne diseases will cease as the water wells are completed.

The second water well will be dedicated to the Lord and in memory of the late Rev. Gene Bates and his family.
