A word from Bobby

The world is a dangerous place, not so much because of evil-doers, but because of Christians who look on and do nothing. As I recently returned home from Africa and Central America, I can honestly reaffirm my original statement about our world. How many children and adults must die before the Christian church wakes up at home and abroad? People are dying spiritually and physically all around the world due to contaminated "waters". The literal waters are contaminated with typhoid, guinea worms or other water-born diseases, but the spiritual waters are contaminated with disobedience to God and His call and can be just as deadly. We are to reconcile the world to God by offering cups of living water to the thirsty. Many of the partners and friends of Unto the Least of His are fulfilling our Christian duty to love our neighbors and God as Jesus commanded us in the Scriptures of the Holy Bible. Clean "waters" changes people forever!

In this economically difficult time, I want to thank you for being the life-givers of clean water in Jesus' name. You are the hearers and doers of the work and words of Jesus by being reconcilers of God. Together we placed another water well in a small nomadic pastoral Maasite village where a 12 year old girl died a few weeks ago due to contaminated water. The mother of this child stood by the digging of the new water well and she stated that her other children would not have to die from contaminated water anymore. When the words and deeds of Christ are demonstrated, others will be reconciled to the Living Waters of God.
