*A word from Bobby*

As we continue our work in the different regions of Africa, and North and Central America, I am realizing more and more the importance of sustainability works and partnerships. In the indigenous Samburu village of Lerate, we collaborated with the village elders, government leaders and Dr. Tina Ramme for another amazing work of God. It was an extremely difficult water well to be drilled, but we were believing God for another miracle in the desert. After much diligence in prayers and old fashion work, we have a praise report for the newest well in the Sub Saharan area of Northern, Kenya. We drilled 168 meters or about 510 feet deep for the most beautiful gift of fresh clean water in the area. Approximately 2500 people and 340 children in the Lerate School and a nearby medical clinic are drinking fresh clean water in Jesus' name. It was not cheap or easy to place this indigenous water well in Lerate. As a result of this miracle, for the first time in their history these people will not have to suffer from lack of water and severe famine. Their lack of water resulted in death and illness due to dehydration, starvation, dysentery, cholera and typhoid fever. I believe that God is smiling on this sustainable work of a new permanent water source for His beautiful children.

It is not time to quit with these sustainable works of God! We have identified 5 more dry areas with greater populations. Saguta, Lorosoro, Serrata, Kalama, and Morit will be our next challenges in Northern Kenya. Also, we are hoping to place another new water well in the Katongola village in the Democratic Republic of the Congo with Dr. Kimba Evariste. These future water wells are not plastic bags or cute bottles of water, but they will be life-giving, sustainable water wells for needy communities. God bless you and we love each one of you our friends and partners in this sustainable and difficult work of God for His overlooked and forgotten children.

## African Angel Project

In Northern Kenya, we have found a women's empowerment ministry that wants to partner with Unto the Least of His for Sub-Saharan drought and famine relief. Famines and droughts are serious climatic events that affect millions of people each year throughout the world. We have identified an area where there are real basic human needs like clean water, food, and shelter. In a small village called Lerate of the Wamba Region, we recently placed our newest water well project where 3000 people are drinking fresh clean water including 340 school children and a small medical clinic.

To help alleviate some of these difficulties of human suffering in Northern Kenya we have created a partnership which is called the African Angel Project. These African women will hand-make these African Angels from indigenous material of their area. For a donation of \$20 you will receive one of these angels. This donation will be in their ministry for the purchasing of drought and famine preventions like cornmeal, sugar and other similar items. Your \$20 will help feed a family of 4 for approximately 30 days.

If you or your church would like to help with this African Angel Project, we would love to partner with you. We could also use your help in distributing and selling through different venues.
