Counting my Blessings

Have you ever laid awake at night and worried about life?

Some people would suggest counting sheep, but I am advising us to count our blessings from the Lord God Almighty. Bing Crosby has an old song called "Count your Blessings", however, recognizing and counting our blessings started way before Bing Crosby and his "White Christmas" song. We have been blessed by our Creator from the beginning and it is right and just to give thanks. As we begin to recognize what we have and we acknowledge with a grateful heart these many blessings, our attitude will be become better.

Recently, I remembered being in Costa Rica with the legendary Rev. Marion Woods and we were complaining about the vehicle that we were riding in. It was his old white jeep that had so many miles on it and the steering issues were compounded by a broken tire rod. We were truly immature and ungrateful for our ride and we were demonstrating it until Marion Woods spoke to us. He acknowledged the complications of his vehicle then he reminded us that we are riding instead of walking like most of the people around us. He reminded us that we did not have to ride in his broken down vehicle and that we could walk or take public transportation like everyone else in Santa Clara. Finally, he asked us North Americans, "Do you know that I am giving you my very best?" The old vehicle did not change one bit, but our perspectives and attitudes did change, especially when we began to count that old vehicle as a blessing instead of a problem.

Another time, I remember staying in an African Boma (mud house) in East Africa with Dr. Michael Lolwerikoi. It was breakfast time and he brought one egg and a pancake with an African cup of Chi. The Chi was made of fresh goat's milk, honey and black tea. I asked him if I could have another pancake. He politely said "no" because there was no more ingredients in the house. Then he asked me a simple question, "do you not know that you have had more breakfast than every person in this village?". I simply forgot how blessed I was.
