Harvest Time! As I have traveled throughout Georgia, I have noticed many farmers are hard at work. Harvesting is the process of gathering ripened crops from the field. Reaping is the cutting of grain for harvest. On large farms, harvesting or reaping usually utilizes expensive and sophisticated farm machinery, such as the combine harvester.

A crop is a plant product that can be grown and harvested extensively for profit or sustenance. Most crops are cultivated in agriculture or aquaculture environments. In Willacoochee Georgia, I remember seeing an aquaculture farm that was producing squash and it was totally brilliant and effective.

There has been a variety of cultivated harvesting that I have seen in South Georgia farming communities like onions, strawberries, cabbages, corn, peanuts and even timber and pine straw gatherings. However, too much or too little rain can complicate the harvesting process and results. Each type of harvesting involves praying, planning and hard work. There is no replacement for any of these steps in the harvesting process.

Unto the Least of His has been praying and strategically working with our partners in the harvesting in Central America, Africa and at home. The hand-made little dresses and book bags are being delivered to the marginalized children. The chicken ministry is clucking along in Costa Rica and the African water well projects are producing fresh clean water for the indigenous and marginalized communities. I recently heard hope from a Georgia Peach, "I thought that my church was going to die, but it looks like we are alive". The medical clinics are providing unique services to the overlooked communities in their areas of the world where malaria is an every day occurrence.

It is definitely harvest time according to the Bible, Jesus said, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few." (Luke 10:2). There is no replacement for you and I want to say thank you for your partnership with us in these labors of love and works of mercies.
