Bringing vaccines to Samburu!



Praise God for the gift of the Josena clinic!! This was the first medical clinic that was built in Samburu.

They rented a portable freezer from Nairobi. Naomi organized the vaccines and all the logistical details related to that and Dipa mobilized the community. (Naomi and Dipa work at Tina's camp in Samburu)

Dipa and Naomi had a meeting about it and informed everyone that they could expect to feel a little tired afterwards, but that it does not mean that they have Covid, instead, it meant that it was working. They had two full days at the clinic and vaccinated 5400 villagers from five communities!
