A Word from Bobby

Two Different Outcomes:

In an African village in Northern Kenya, several women, one being pregnant, went to fetch water for their family from the river. They walked about a mile to get the water and filled up their 5-gallon jerry cans and then carried the water back to their mud house. While gathering water from the river, it became time for the woman to give birth. She delivered the child naturally on the river bank with no midwife and no modern medical services to assist in her complex birthing situation. Then she and her friends walked back home with her new baby. That night something went wrong and the mother passed away.

In another village where we built and placed the Josena Medical Clinic, a woman was having a very complicated birthing situation. It was during the night and they placed the pregnant woman in a wheel-barrow and pushed her to the newly built medical clinic. She was met by a medical person that helped save her life and the baby's life. Soon she was able to go home with her newborn baby wrapped in a beautiful handmade blanket. The mother was so grateful for the clinic that she named her baby *Josena*.

What made the difference in these two situations? I believe that it was a medical clinic that was built from compassion for the medically underserved people of God. Jesus was often moved by seeing someone's suffering, then he would meet the needs with compassionate love. Biblical compassion alludes to kindness and empathy for a suffering world. To be compassionate is to not just tell someone that you care, but also to show them that you care by being there before they even ask for it. Helping to relieve human sufferings and poverty issues such as clean water, keeping children in school, helping to feed a family in need and to share the Gospel is to be alive in God's business.

It has been a great joy to work and to develop these solar powered OB/GYN medical clinics and water well projects with our friends and partners. Our goal is to build 10 medical clinics, then we want to place a fresh clean water well at each site as it is possible. Three clinics have been sent to Ghana, Africa with millions of dollars of pharmaceutical supplies and medicines. Three more clinics are completed and ready to be sent and 3 others are in the planning and developing stages.

In Acts 2:16-18 Peter reminds us of the words of Joel from the Old Testament.

But, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 17 "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. 18 Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.

It's an exciting time to be alive in Christ!



It is not always easy!

This solar powered cargo container clinic took 3 months to make it from Georgia, USA to Musa Nkwanta, a village in Western Ghana. It took 4 days to get it from the port in Ghana to the village because of heavy rains. People from villages along the way helped fill trenches with sandbags, until they finally got a bulldozer to take it the last stretch. Eight hundred people showed up in



the dark to see the clinic on its final resting spot. Thank you, partners, of Unto The Least of His for this terrific build-out, Williams Brothers Trucking for transport in USA, Consolidated Shipping Agencies Ltd- Conship for providing the truck and crane in Ghana, Ofosu Okutu for being the most spectacular volunteer ever, and Oscar Ofori Larbi for saving the day with a bulldozer!
