A Word from Bobby

Access to clean water and healthcare are basic human needs yet many villages in Ghana, Africa struggle to have access to these basic necessities causing waterborne diseases and other illnesses that can be deadly. That's why our initiatives to provide clean water and medical care are so important. And now, thanks to the collaboration of a number of friends, partners, churches and organizations the beautiful people of Ghana are seeing some real progress!

The Tin Can Miracles initiative is the building of solar-powered medical clinics for remote villages. These tiny clinics not only provide essential medical care, but they also have the added benefit of being powered by the sun. This means that the clinics are sustainable and cost-effective as they don't rely on expensive fossil fuels or grid electricity. The solar panels will help provide electricity to run medical equipment, lights, and small fans to help keep patients cool in the hot Ghanaian climate.

The World Health Organization has emphasized the importance of clean water and sanitation in improving health outcomes, stating that "the provision of safe water, sanitation and hygiene is essential to protecting human health during all infectious disease outbreaks, including the COVID-19 outbreak". We are placing water wells by each clinic because clean water is a key component to good health. The clinics will have clean water systems that provide safe drinking water and enable proper hygiene practices to prevent the spread of disease.

The Bible also speaks to the importance of providing for those in need, particularly in terms of basic necessities, such as food, water, clothing and healthcare. In Matthew 25:35-36, Jesus says, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me". This passage emphasizes the importance of caring for those who are in need, and the building of these solar-powered clinics in Ghana is a testament to that.

Through these works of mercies, we can see the positive impact that clean water and sustainable healthcare can have on communities. Not only do they improve health outcomes, but they also promote sustainability and economic growth. With continued efforts to provide these essential resources to those in need, we can work towards a brighter and healthier future for all God's people.


