A Word from Bobby: Hearing the Whispers of God

As we approach the milestone of celebrating 20 years of ministry with Unto the Least of His, it is time for deep reflection and gratitude for the journey we have been on. One of the most profound aspects of this ministry has been the experience of hearing the whispers of God throughout these years.

The Yonkofa Project clinics are working! In Asuoklo, Ghana, this clinic was built by friends in Georgia. The Unto The Least of His ministry helped convert a cargo container into a general medical facility. The container was stuffed with medical supplies and sent to Ghana. The land was graded, foundation poured, deep well drilled with a solar pump and water tower. The cargo container in Ghana was placed on the prepared lot by Consolidated Shipping Agencies Ltd-Conship and a roof was built over the clinic.
